JACKDAW PUBLIC NOTICE

The Offshore Chemicals Regulations 2002 (as amended)

Adura Operations Limited has applied to the Secretary of State for Energy Security and Net Zero for a permit to use and discharge chemicals in connection with the Jackdaw Field Development located in Blocks 30/02 and 30/03, the Jackdaw wellhead platform has the following geographical co-ordinates: Latitude 56° 54' 01.37" N and Longitude 02° 22' 45.45" E, as required under the Offshore Chemicals Regulations 2002 ("OCR"). The Jackdaw field is located in the Central North Sea (CNS), approximately 250 km east of Aberdeen adjacent to the UK/Norway median line.

The OCR application relates to the proposed use and discharge of the following chemicals: Castrol Brayco Micronic SV/4 and SV/3; MEG (all grades); Monoethylene Glycol (1,2 ETHANEDIOL); Methanol (all grades); PARA12193B; SCAL16662A; SOBO S GOLD 08 and SOBO S GOLD 40.
